THE LUCIUS POLK McGEHEE
MEMORIAL FUND

The Trustees have announced that the University has received from a donor who declines to permit his name to be disclosed, a gift of \$10,000 to be expended for books for the Law Library. By the wish of the giver, the fund will be known as the Lucius Polk McGehee Memorial Fund, in honor of the late Dean McGehee, who was himself a maker and a discriminating collector of books, and a builder of the Law Library. This generous gift will greatly aid in the effort now being made to develop a well-rounded Law Library. A large part of it will go toward the completion of a collection of the more important statutory material of the various States, and to securing certain intermediate appellate reports. The members of the Bar are cordially invited to visit the Law Library and to use it. It includes the reported decisions of all the courts of last resort of the United States and England, and a large number of well selected texts and reference works.
