Current Research in Law, The Institute of Law. The Johns Hopkins Press, Baltimore, 1930. Pp. x, 298. \$2.00.

This is a cross-section index of the legal investigations projected or under way in the United States in the late spring of 1930 by bar associations, commissions, judicial councils, governmental agencies, university teachers of law and related subjects, lawyers and other individuals. It is the second to appear, the first having been issued a year ago. The tabulated information is of immense usefulness to the investigator who would like to know what is being attempted by other workers in his field. Obviously, for the hundreds of undertakings listed, no qualitative evaluation could be thought of. Nor does the publication seek to compete with indices of already published material.
