NOTE FROM THE BOARD OF EDITORS

Since articles for Issue 2, Volume 11 of the *North Carolina Journal of International Law and Commercial Regulation* were accepted for publication, a major decision relating to grey market goods (the subject matter of much of Issue 2), was reversed. See *Coalition to Preserve the Integrity of American Trademarks (COPIAT) v. United States*, 598 F. Supp. 844 (D.D.C. 1984), *rev'd*, 790 F.2d 903 (D.C. Cir. 1986). *COPIAT* was referred to in a number of articles in Issue 2 and the Board of Editors deemed it important to note its reversal.
