Enough has been said, however, to indicate that, regrettably, the effort and resources which have gone into Mr. Toulmin's book have not produced a volume that has utility except as an expression of the opinions of one who has given attention to the problems reviewed. Appendices of over 100 pages containing the leading anti-trust statutes and a number of typical trade practice rules and agreements add supplementary concrete material to the presentation.
