**Lawyers and the Promotion of Justice.** By Esther L. Brown. New York: Russell Sage Foundation. 1938. Pp. ix, 291. \$1.00.

A monograph on the status of the legal profession. It includes surveys of the facilities and problems of legal education, statistics on the lawyer's income, and a critical analysis of the success with which the profession is carrying out its function in society.

**Court over Constitution.** By Edward S. Corwin. Princeton: Princeton University Press. 1938. Pp. ix, 273. \$2.50.

A study of judicial review as an instrument of popular government, with emphasis on the fact that the only check on the exercise of judicial power by the Supreme Court of the United States is the Court's own sense of self-restraint.

**Chapter Ten.** By Luther D. Swanstrom. Chicago: The Foundation Press, Inc. 1938. Pp. x, 473. \$10.

A treatise on corporate reorganization under the federal statute. The case law under Section 77B is arranged to show, as far as possible, the derivation of various sections of Chapter X from Section 77B; and Chapter X is annotated in so far as it has been adjudicated.
