THE LAW SCHOOL

The registration for the fall semester of the ninety-fifth session of the Law School of the University of North Carolina is 125, as compared with 103 for 1937-1938. Of this enrollment, 58 are in the first-year class; 42 in the second-year class; and 25 in the third-year class. The total number of students with college degrees is 85, or 68 per cent of the School's enrollment. There are twelve students from outside of North Carolina: one each from Alabama, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, and Virginia; two from Georgia; and four from South Carolina.
