## BOOK NOTES

**Handbook on Constitutional Law.** By Henry Rottschaefer. St. Paul: West Publishing Co. 1939. Pp. xix, 875. \$5.00.

This is a treatise on the total body of constitutional law which, because of the impossibility of dealing with the entire body of that law, is limited to a discussion of certain general principles incorporated in all state constitutions as well as the Federal Constitution. The method of treatment is analytical rather than historical, but where practicable the material is arranged to demonstrate the changes in the adaptation of constitutional formulae to the needs of a dynamic society.
