The Tort Liability of Public Officers. By Leon Thomas David. Chicago: Public Administration Service. 1940. Pp. v, 93. \$1.00.

In this monograph the law of California on the tort liability of public officers is set out and supplemented by a commentary on the law in other jurisdictions.

Cases on Federal Jurisdiction and Procedure. By Armistead M. Dobie and Mason Ladd. St. Paul: West Publishing Co. 1940. Pp. lxiv, 1091.

There have been so many epoch-making developments in this field that the publishers, while using Dobie's casebook as a take-off, chose to publish a new work rather than a second edition.

Cases on Business Associations. By E. Merrick Dodd, Jr. and Ralph J. Baker. Chicago: The Foundation Press, Inc. 1940. Pp. xi, 1306. \$6.50.

This volume, the first of a two-volume series, contains material for the study of the fundamental principles of corporation law. The second volume shall include materials for a study of corporate enterprises with complicated share or bond set-ups, etc.

The Law in Quest of Itself. By Lon L. Fuller. Chicago: The Foundation Press, Inc. 1940. Pp. vii, 147. \$2.00.

This is a publication by the Julius Rosenthal Foundation of three lectures on jurisprudence delivered at the Law School of Northwestern University.

The Law of Bills and Notes. By Henry W. Humble. Brooklyn: Harmon Publications. 1939. Pp. xx, 390. \$4.00.

This book takes up the N.I.L. section by section, explaining the inconsistencies and need for changes therein.

Look at the Law. By Percival E. Jackson. New York: E. P. Dutton & Co., Inc. 1940. Pp. 12, 377. \$2.75.

This book is a searching analysis of the practices of the bench and bar by a very able practicing lawyer.

Law Office Management. Revised Edition. By Dwight G. McCarty. New York: Prentice-Hall, Inc. 1940. Pp. xxiii, 561. \$5.00.

This volume presents information useful in solving the office problems of the practicing attorney.

When Civil Law Fails. By Robert S. Rankin. Durham: Duke University Press. 1939. Pp. vii, 224. \$3.00.

Mr. Rankin in this volume traces the development of the use of martial law in the United States and its use in our modern industrial life.

The Constitution of the United States at the End of One Hundred Fifty Years. By Hugh Evander Willis. Bloomington: Indiana University Publications. 1939. Pp. 7, 72. \$0.75.

The purpose of this publication is to give to the general public the Constitution of 1939. The additions, interpretations, and changes in the original document are shown so as to make available a modern transcription of our fundamental law.
