G.I. Rights and Army Justice: The Draftee's Guide to Military Life and Law. By Robert S. Rivkin. New York: Grove Press, 1970. Pp. 383. \$1.75.

The author, an army veteran, describes the military system from the draftee's viewpoint. The basic theme is to analyze that system and outline the procedures and rights available to the draftee in dealing with it.

The Rise of the Accounting Profession, Vol. 2. By John L. Carey. New York: American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Pp. 545. \$10.00.

This second volume in the history of the accounting profession covers the years 1937-1969. These are the years during which the accounting profession rose to a position of responsibility and authority in the United States.

Lawyers for People of Moderate Means. By Barlow F. Christensen. Chicago: American Bar Foundation, 1970. Pp. 313. Cloth \$7.50, Paperbound \$5.00.

A study of the various methods proposed for increasing the legal services available to the poor and near-poor. Explores such topics as legal aid, group legal services, lawyer referral services and others. All aspects of the topic are considered, including the practical and professional restrictions presently existing.

Probate Can Be Quick and Cheap: Trusts and Estates in England. By William F. Fratcher. New York: Pageant Press, 1968. Pp. 106. \$3.50.

A study of the present English practice which has vastly simplified the administration of estates and trusts; the book includes a comparison of the American vehicles for achieving the same results at greater expense and more slowly.

Commercial Transactions, Cases and Materials. Soia Mentschikoff. Boston: Little, Brown & Co., 1970. Pp. 1113.

This is a casebook covering the areas of sales and secured transactions, with emphasis on the Uniform Commercial Code.
