“TO ENDURE FOR AGES TO COME”: A BICENTENNIAL VIEW OF THE CONSTITUTION

On April 11, 1987, the School of Law of the University of North Carolina, in conjunction with the North Carolina Commission on the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution, hosted a symposium in celebration of the Constitution's 200th anniversary.
